

Memorandum of cooperation

concluded on by and between:

the Faculty of Civil Engineering and Resource Management of the AGH University of Science and Technology (WILiGZ AGH) in Kraków, al. Mickiewicza 30, represented for the purpose of conclusion of this memorandum by:

Prof. dr hab. inż. Marek Cała – Dean of the Faculty,
hereinafter referred to as **WILiGZ AGH**

and

the Faculty of Construction of the Kyiv National University of Construction and Architecture (FC KNUCA), Povitroflotskyi Av. 31, represented for the purpose of conclusion of this memorandum by:

Prof. dr hab. inż. Grygoryi Ivanchenko – Dean of the Faculty,
hereinafter referred to as **FC KNUCA**

Whereas the objective of both parties is to establish long-term cooperation between FC KNUCA and WILiGZ AGH, the parties conclude this Memorandum of Cooperation (hereinafter referred to as the "Memorandum"), which reads as follows:

Art. 1

KNUCA is the main university of Ukraine, which conducts research and education in the field of construction and architecture. Scientific schools of the university are known in Ukraine and abroad. The high level of professional training is based on the involvement of the most modern educational technologies. KNUCA is following the path of integration of traditional learning technologies with modern forms, we are introducing European approaches to the preparation of a new generation of builders and architects. Joint scientific and educational programs with universities of the European Union and other countries have been developed and are successfully operating.

Art. 2

The AGH University is an internationally recognized school, which conducts research and education in the field of technical sciences as a basis for the development of a wide range of applied sciences. Keeping up with the world's development trends, AGH University of Science and Technology (AGH) is creating new didactic directions while maintaining the classical ones, necessary for the proper development of the country. The university supports all activities aimed at creating strong research teams: inter-faculty, intercollegiate and international. Conducting scientific research at a high level, in various fields and scientific disciplines, it ensures a high level of education and staff development, which is one of the fundamental elements of the functioning and position of the University.

Art. 3

By concluding this Memorandum, the Parties declare their intention and willingness to cooperate. The Parties declare a free exchange of views and experience, while acting within the framework of fair, responsible and acceptable practices, relating to intellectual

property rights, respecting the legally protected economic and non-economic interests of the Parties.

Art. 4

During the term of this Memorandum, the Parties declare their intention to cooperate in the areas of:

- conducting scientific research jointly;
- initiating scientific and research works aimed at improving applied solutions for the mining industry in terms of increasing safety, implementing new effective products, reducing costs;

Art. 5

The Parties agree that the cooperation on the basis of the Parties' detailed arrangements may be implemented in particular by:

- initiating research and development works in the common area of interest of AGH and KNUCA,
- launching and realizing projects aimed at development and implementation of innovative technological solutions,
- individual and joint commitment to raise funds from national and European sources for the realization of the said undertakings,
- promoting the cooperation between AGH and KNUCA,
- organizing joint informational meetings, seminars and workshops to promote an education profile that meets expectations,
- organizing internships for students, as a part of jointly implemented projects,
- other joint activities aimed at developing science and technology, including the organization of conferences,
- executing orders for the private sector and institutions in areas, where both AGH and KNUCA specialize.

Art. 6

The scope and detailed terms and conditions of cooperation, within the framework of individual projects implemented under this Memorandum, including the division of intellectual property rights to the results of scientific research, will be determined each time in the agreements (the so-called specific agreements), concluded by AGH and KNUCA.

Art. 7

1. The signing of this Memorandum does not create any obligations for its Parties.
2. Potential obligations for the Parties shall be defined in the specific agreements referred to in Art. 6, which shall be related to the realization of joint projects.

Art. 8

The Parties undertake to preserve the confidentiality of the content of specific agreements and terms of cooperation in the scope of documents, oral and written information, remaining in relation to the subject of cooperation.


Art. 10

1. The Memorandum shall be concluded for an indefinite period.
2. Amendments or supplements to this Memorandum may only be made in writing, under pain of invalidity.
3. The Parties shall declare to preserve the confidentiality of non-public information concerning the other Party obtained during the term of the Memorandum.
4. The Memorandum may be unilaterally terminated by each of the Parties, without providing reason, with one month's notice, in writing, under pain of invalidity.
5. The termination of the Memorandum shall not result in the expiry of specific agreements detailed in Art. 6 and concluded during its term.

Art. 11

1. This Memorandum does not constitute an agreement within the meaning of the Civil Code. The signing of this Memorandum shall not result in any legal or financial obligations for the Parties.
2. This Memorandum shall enter into force on the date of signature.
3. This Memorandum is drawn up in two identical counterparts, one for each Party.
