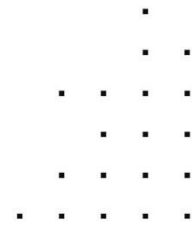

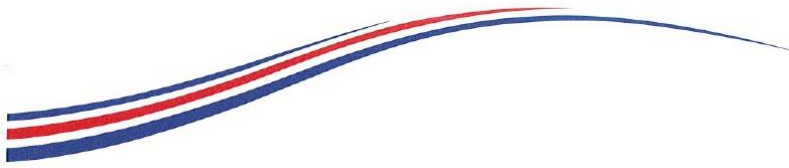

Presenting and lecturing on a topic using appropriate signposting techniques

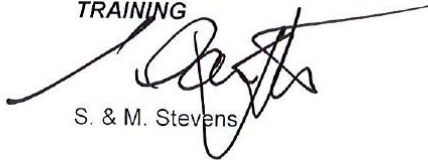
Checking and guiding the students understanding of the topic
